

Notes to Condensed Financial Statements (Unaudited)

- 1. The condensed financial statements of Bowlin Travel Centers, Inc. (the "Company") as of and for the three months and nine months ended October 2014 and 2013 are unaudited and reflect all adjustments (consisting only of normal recurring adjustments) which are, in the opinion of management, necessary for a fair presentation of the financial position, operating results and cash flows for the interim periods. The interim financial statements should be read in conjunction with the audited financial statements and notes for the fiscal year ended January 31, 2014. Results of operations for interim periods are not necessarily indicative of results that may be expected for the fiscal year as a whole.
- 2. The Company continues to list for sale one retail location in Edgewood, New Mexico.

The property, fixtures and equipment located in Edgewood that are listed for sale have been identified as a component as defined in FASB ASC 2005-20-45 – Accounting for Impairment or Disposal of Long-Lived Assets (as amended). The carrying value of the property, fixtures and equipment of approximately \$412,000 have been reclassified as assets held for sale in the October 31, 2014 and the January 31, 2014 balance sheets. On October 31, 2007, the Company closed the Edgewood location.

On July 1, 2013, the Company entered into a periodic tenancy commercial lease agreement for the property. The tenant will have a first right of refusal to purchase the property should the Company receive a third party bona fide offer to sell the property. The lease expired June 30, 2014 and the current tenants continue to lease the property on a month-to-month basis.

3. In September 2014, the Board of Directors voted to continue the stock repurchase program that began in September 2008, whereby up to 1,000,000 shares of its common stock outstanding may be repurchased in the open market or in privately negotiated purchases from time to time, depending on market conditions and other factors. The purchases will be funded from available working capital and will be made in accordance with applicable securities laws and regulations.

The Company repurchased 19,553 of its outstanding common shares for the nine months ended October 31, 2014 at an average price per share of approximately \$1.40, for a total repurchase of approximately \$27,457. The common stock issued and outstanding was reduced by 19,553 shares or \$20 (19,553 shares times the par value of \$0.001), and additional paid in capital was reduced by \$27,437. The reduction in shares issued and outstanding and additional paid in capital is reflected in the accompanying balance sheet.

4. On June 30, 2014, the Company entered into a commercial loan agreement with WestStar Bank in the amount of \$1,500,000 with an interest rate of 4.75% for the first five years, then subject to adjustment June 30, 2019. The Company's real property in Bernalillo County, New Mexico and one property in Dona Ana County, New Mexico will serve as security for the new loan. The new commercial loan agreement matures June 30, 2024. A portion of the proceeds were used to pay off an existing loan with Bank of the West which released the Company's real property in Cochise County, Arizona that was serving as collateral for the debt.
